Invitation to Edinburgh

Dear colleagues

A lot has happened since we all last met at the Fifth European Meeting of Animal Chlamydioses (EMAC-5) in Odesa, Ukraine in 2018. So it gives gives me great pleasure to invite you all to the sixth meeting (EMAC-6) which will be held in Edinburgh on the 28-29th November 2023. This will also be the first meeting organised by the newly founded European Society of Animal Chlamydioses and associated Zoonoses (ESACZ).

The conference will be held at the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh (RCPE), which is located in the centre of the City, very close to Princes Street, the historic Royal Mile, Edinburgh Castle and the Palace of Holyrood House, the official residence of King Charles in Edinburgh. The main conference will take place in the recently refurbished auditorium of the 'Physicians International Conference Centre' at the RCPE, with the poster session being held in the foyer alongside exhibitors and sponsors of the meeting. A drinks reception will be held during the poster session at the end of the first day, although posters will be available throughout the two days. The local organising committee has organised a pre-dinner drinks reception in the Victorian New Library followed by the conference dinner in the Victorian Great Hall at the RCPE at the close of the meeting on the second day. Your conference registration fee covers breaks, lunches, the two receptions and conference dinner.








Travel to Edinburgh

By train: Edinburgh is served by frequent direct train services from London to Waverley Station, and is easily reached from other main English towns and cities, though you may have to change trains en route.

By air: Edinburgh Airport is approximately 7 miles to the West of the city and is served by direct international flights from many countries in Europe or via connecting flights eg London and Amsterdam. Edinburgh city centre can be easily reached by bus, taxi or tram:





<u>BUS</u>: Tickets for the Airlink 100, taking you straight to the city centre, can be purchased from the driver as you board using contactless card payment, m-tickets (using mobile app) or the **exact** cash fare.

Airlink 100 to/from St Andrew Square

Goes to St Andrew Square, close to Princes Street, and close to all central hotels and the meeting venue.

Arrivals: Hop on at Stop A (next to the Plaza). Departs airport every 10 minutes during the day (04:30 - 01:00) and every 30 minutes during the night (01:00 - 04:30) Monday to Sunday

Departures: Departs South St David Street (at St Andrew Square) every 10 minutes during the day (04:00 - 00:10) and every 30 minutes during the night (00:30 - 04:00).

Average journey time is 30 minutes. Adult single fare £5.50. Adult open return ticket £8.00.

TRAM: Trams are one of the easiest ways to get to and from the airport with fast and frequent services to Edinburgh city centre. Trams depart every 7 minutes, between 7am and 7pm, and every 15 minutes outwith these hours, with an end-to-end journey of just 30 minutes.

Adult single fare £7.50. Adult open return £9.50. Central Edinburgh stops: West End, Princes Street and St. Andrew's Square. Ticket must be purchased **before** getting on tram at vending machine at tram stop or <u>online</u> and presented to ticket inspector on the tram.



TAXI: Just a 20 minute drive to the city centre depending on traffic.

If you're arriving at the airport, find a taxi or a private hire vehicle in the East Terminus facility located just across the plaza from the main terminal (up ramp to left of trams). **Typical cost is £36-£40**.


Hotels in Edinburgh


There are approximately 150 hotels and 37 hotel chains in Edinburgh. Around 92 of them are independent hotels.

This provides plenty of choice and a range of price points. Edinburgh is also a very popular tourist destination and prices do rise as rooms are booked and depending on season.

Therefore, it is very important to book your hotel as soon as you commit and register to attend the meeting, as prices will rise.

Although there are plenty of hotels in central Edinburgh, there are also many hotels in the West side of the city along the tram route from the airport to the city centre that you can also consider. The centre of Edinburgh is easily accessible via the tram line (nearest stops to conference venue are Princes Street (yellow circle) and St. Andrew's Square (blue circle) stops).





While we are not endorsing any specific hotel here are a few examples of some centrally located hotels not too far from the conference venue.



Sightseeeing and things to do

Edinburgh is a very diverse city with plenty to keep you occupied outside of the conference or for any accompanying persons to enjoy. With its abundance of history (exploring the Medieval Old Town and elegant Georgian New Town side by side separated by Princes Street), beautiful architecture, attractions, exhibitions, world-class festivals and not to mention the huge number of bars, pubs and restaurants, it is worth extending your stay a day or two to enjoy some of these. Check out <u>VisitScotland</u>.

At the time of the conference Edinburgh will be just starting its <u>Winter Festival Programme</u>, with different events going on around the city centre including the Christmas Market and ice-skating.
